Subject: FW: ISDA rulemaking

Scott,

Here are our suggested changes for the Rules Governing Dairy Byproducts (deletions highlighted, additions in red):

03. Pasturing of Dairy Animals. Pasturing dairy animals and other animals owned, leased or otherwise under the control of a producer, within a pasture, shall be incorporated in and subject to the DNMP. Soil tests shall be conducted every three (3) years on all lands utilized as pasture. If soil tests exceed nutrient threshold(s), **the producers** shall be required to reduce the number of animals on pasture and/or reduce land application of nutrients. **If a producer's** animals have access to surface water within **the a** pasture, **the** producer may be required to implement one or more NRCS conservation practice standards to minimize adverse impacts on **bodies of surface** water **quality**. If land application occurs within a pasture, soil tests shall be conducted annually on that pasture Confinement areas shall not be considered part of a pasture.
