## Agriculture in Idaho

Idaho covers an area of 82,751 square miles. With all this land Idaho's agriculture is plentiful and diverse. Nature's bounty provides the perfect growing conditions for Idaho agriculture. Idaho's rolling hills, mountain spring water, gentle rains, and warm sunshine combined with state-of-the-art technology, produce superior agricultural products. In addition to the famous Idaho potato, the state produces 185 different commodities and is ranked in the top ten in the nation for 27 different crops and livestock.

Agriculture is a growing industry in Idaho, setting records for cash receipts in eight of the last ten years. Cash receipts for 2013 were at \$8.3 billion, led by the dairy industry. Food and beverage processing is Idaho's second largest manufacturing sector. Together, agriculture and food processing are the backbone of much of rural Idaho. Idaho agriculture is strong and remains the state's leading natural resource-based industry.

**Idaho Seeds:** Idaho grows 70% of the hybrid temperate sweet corn seed produced in the world. Idaho also ranks among the leading suppliers of alfalfa, field bean, garden bean, and Kentucky bluegrass seed. Idaho vegetable seed production includes carrot, onion, turnip, lettuce and many more.

**Idaho Wines:** The first grapes were grown in Idaho in 1864. Idaho now has over 1,300 acres in vineyards with over 50 wineries producing many varieties of award winning wine. The Snake River Valley American Viticultural Area (AVA) covers 8,263 square miles and is Idaho's first registered AVA.
